Interior Design

The Interior Designer is a professional qualified to analyse, investigate and design and also to direct team projects and to carry out interior design work, as well as to act as a direct interlocutor with the public administration in their field of work.

Their main areas of professional activity are:

- Design of dwellings and interior living spaces.
- Design of commercial and leisure spaces.
- Design of office spaces.
- Design of cultural and educational spaces.
- Design of ephemeral spaces.
- Home refurbishment.
- Landscaping and public spaces design.
- Transport systems interiors design.
- Interior design project management.
- Research and teaching.
- Site management, measurements, budgeting and risk prevention related to the field of interior design.

▲ Qualification

The Advanced Art Qualifications in Design taught at the Jerez School of Art are Official Advanced Qualifications and consist of 240 ECTS credits divided into eight terms and a duration of four years. Each credit corresponds to 30 hours of tuition. The successful completion of the 240 ECTS credits leads to the qualification of Arts Degree majoring in Interior Design, with recognition and certification of university credits. Equivalent to an University Degree according to the Spanish Legislation: , artículo 57.4 de la Ley Orgánica 2/2006, de 3 de mayo de Educación. Real Decreto 1614/2009, de 26 de octubre, by which Art Higher Studies regulated by the Ley Orgánica 2/2006 de 3 de mayo de Educación are ordained.

Aiming to promote the mobility of Spanish undergraduates and graduates within the European Higher Education Area, the education authorities will issue, together with the qualification, the corresponding European Supplement to the Degree.
